SYLLABUS FOR MA (English Literature) DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH AND FOREIGN LANGUAGES SHIATS

Total Papers 15 (with dissertation/project) [Credits: 80 (15x4 + 20)]

There are fifteen papers that students must clear along with a dissertation/project to be eligible for the master's degree from the department. All papers in the first and second semesters are compulsory. In the third and fourth semesters, students will have two and one compulsory paper respectively. Two papers in each of the latter semesters will have options. In the fourth semesters, students are required to work on their project that must be submitted by the end of that semester.

In any given semester, only four texts or authors will be covered.

The department conducts one final exam (70 marks) at the end of the semester. CCA (Continuous Class Assessment) constitutes the remaining 30 marks. Under CCA, students appear for minimum of three tests, submit three assignments and give two presentations for each paper.
